ACT OF VIOLENCE RESPONSE

Today, we are seeing an increase in violent crime across the United States. The FBI's "Uniform Crime Reporting" program showed that violent crime jumped 30% in 2020*. Over the last few months, the nation has witnessed organized 'smash & grab' attacks on retail stores, malls, and office buildings.

Is your organization prepared for an act of violence?

ACT OF VIOLENCE TRAINING

Communicate training plans to maximize response effectiveness and minimize the risk of misunderstanding. No one expects to be involved in a workplace violence situation but by scheduling regular drills—and effectively communicating about these exercises—your company can train employees on potential scenarios they may face.

VIOLENCE IN BUILDING OR ON PROPERTY

Observers to violent situations, including mass shootings, often report later that they heard the sound of gunfire but initially dismissed the sounds as fireworks or other noises. As soon as the shooting is confirmed, you must protect your people by quickly communicating about the violence in the building or on the property. These early messages will inform your people that a violent situation has been observed, where the situation is located, that they should evacuate immediately or stay away if they are not on-site, and to wait for further instruction. Alert employees that a violent person is in the vicinity and direct them (if safe) to exit the building or hide and barricade doors. Remind employees not to confront the perpetrator unless there is no other option.

Use Titan HST's preset broadcast message feature to plan ahead. Create detailed instruction templates for the various scenarios and if a violent situation ever occurs, fill in the blanks (e.g. location of the crime, description of the assailant, etc.) before quickly sending your message.

VIOLENCE NEAR EMPLOYEE'S PHYSICAL LOCATION

In the event of a shooting or other situation that's too close for comfort, it's vital to ensure all employees are safe, accounted for, and out of harm's way. Using Titan HST's safety status feature, your organization can rapidly confirm which team members are safe and who may need assistance.

Employees who might be travelling near the act of violence may be inadvertently affected by traffic detours, emergency response, or other byproduct of the situation.

Along with news outlets, social media platforms can also give real time updates on a situation due to the live streaming abilities many platforms are starting to use.
